

Community Garden Frequently Asked Questions

- When will garden registration open?

- o Answer – April 15th, 2026

- How much does it cost?

- o Answer - \$40 for a single plot

- o Answer - \$60 for a double plot

- How big is a garden plot?

- o Answer - Single Plots are 30 feet long with 3 full rows and 2 half rows.

- o Answer - Double Plots are 30 feet long with 6 full rows and 2 half rows.

- Does the community garden provide me with seeds or garden starts?

- o Answer - No

- When can I start gardening?

- o Answer – This is weather dependent and will be communicated by email after registration. Typical entry to begin work is mid-May. Gardens must be cultivated by May 31st.

- What tools are supplied by the community garden?

- o Answer – Essentially none, however, there are some tools that collectively remain after a season that become property of the Community Garden. These tools can be used on a first come first serve basis and must be cleaned and returned each night to the shed when you are finished using them.

- What are the requirements for a person to become a member of the garden?

- o Answer - Members are required to meet the obligations outlined in the Community Garden Agreement.

- How often is there an irrigation pull?

- o Answer – an irrigation pull happens every 10 days.

- How many irrigation pulls will I need to attend during the gardening season?

- o Answer – 2 irrigation pulls

- Can I water my plot between irrigation pulls?

- o Answer – yes there are 2 hose bibs onsite that can help accommodate watering needs.

- Can I use round up to spray the weeds in my garden plot?

- o Answer – No. The Community Garden is a chemical free environment.

- What can I do to mitigate the weeds in my garden plot?

- o Answer – You can manually remove any weed from your own plot by hand.

- What is a community weed pull?

- o Answer – It is a time when you clean up the common areas within the garden. You are required to sign up for 2 weed pull events during the season. They happen 1-2 times a month as needed.

- Can I bring a small tool shed or cabinet to store my supplies?

- o Answer – No

- Do I have to clean up the garden plot at the end of the season?

- o Answer – Yes! Plots must be cleaned by the requested date each year. This date will be communicated through email once identified. This date is generally shortly after the first hard frost. Most often in mid-October.

- Is there a gate to keep unwanted visitors out.

- o Answer – Yes

- Do I have to live in Herriman to register for a plot?

- o Answer – No, but first preference is given to Herriman City residents
