Herriman City names Cody Stromberg as Chief of Police

HERRIMAN— Herriman City has named Cody Stromberg as its Chief of Police following approval by the City Council at its Wednesday evening meeting. Stromberg previously served as the Herriman City Police Department’s deputy chief and interim chief following the retirement of former Chief Troy Carr.

Stromberg was one of the original four members of the Herriman City Police Department when it was formed in 2018. He has lived in Herriman for more than 25 years and has spent most of his law enforcement career serving the Herriman community.

A ceremonial swearing-in will be held at the next City Council meeting on May 27 at 7:00 p.m. at the Herriman City Hall (5355 W. Main Street).

Chief Cody Stromberg:

Stromberg and his wife, Nicole, have served the Herriman community in many capacities throughout the years, including the Herriman Arts Council, multiple school community councils, youth sports groups, the Fort Herriman PRCA Rodeo Committee, and he currently volunteers as a varsity football coach at Herriman High School. They have four teenage children, including three still in high school at both Herriman and Mountain Ridge, and are proud parents of a Utah Army National Guard soldier.
